Residents, Family and Staff:

The facility is once again open to visitations. However, due to the increase in COVID-19 cases we are asking that you exercise good judgement before coming to the nursing home. Indications show that some visitors are coming into the facility who either have or have been exposed to COVID-19. If you are experiencing any signs or symptoms of the virus, please do not come to the facility. Go to your health care provider or a site offering COVID testing. If you have knowingly been exposed to someone who has the virus, please do not come to the facility for at least five days afterwards and until you get tested. If you have been in the company of folks whom you do not know without practicing good infection control protocols, it is suggested that you get tested. The greater percentage of folks testing positive have been asymptomatic, so they are unaware they have the COVID-19 virus.

We understand that visiting your loved one is very important and good all-around for everyone's wellbeing. We have the ability to offer virtual visits in lieu of in-person visits until such time that you feel comfortable coming in to building. These can be arranged by calling Lindsey Emde, our Life Enrichment Coordinator at (617) 825-6320.

Again, the facility is now open for visitations. But we need your help for the safety of our residents and for yours as well. Do not come to the facility if there is any doubt in your mind that you have or have been exposed to the virus. Please know that you should still be cautious if you are fully vaccinated and had a booster shot as well. While these may lessen the effects of the virus, they do not totally eliminate the chance that you will get it.
